Dear Colleagues,

On behalf of the International Association of Providers of AIDS Care (IAPAC) and Fast-Track Cities Institute (FTCI), I welcome you to the **Eliminating the Hepatitis C Epidemic in Urban Settings Workshop**.

Globally, an estimated 58 million people have chronic HCV infection, and a significant number of those will develop cirrhosis or liver cancer if undiagnosed and, thus, untreated. While there is currently no effective HCV vaccine, direct-acting antivirals (DAAs) can cure more than 95% of persons with HCV infection, reducing the risk of death from cirrhosis and liver cancer, but also facilitating cure as prevention (CasP). Yet, access to HCV diagnosis and treatment is critically low. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), only an estimated 10% of people living with chronic HCV infection know their diagnosis, and of those diagnosed, less than 10% have been treated with DAAs.

We are committed to assisting Fast-Track Cities to localize the WHO's global goal of eliminating HCV infections by 2030 by attaining a series of programmatic targets, notably diagnosing 90% of people living with HCV and treating 80% of those by 2030. Our objectives in this regard include:

- Diversifying healthcare provider cadres to facilitate HCV elimination
- Engaging with affected communities to prioritize HCV elimination
- Implementing primary and secondary HCV prevention interventions
- Screening and testing HCV unawares and improving their care coordination
- Facilitating access to harm reduction services for patients at increased risk for HCV
- Promoting prompt treatment initiation with DAAs for HCV-positive patients
- Maximizing patient engagement to achieve higher HCV cure rates and CasP
- Mitigating stigma as a barrier to accessing and utilizing HCV services
- Addressing health disparities contributing to suboptimal HCV service utilization
- Accelerating uptake of innovative public health policies to optimize HCV responses

During today's Workshop, you will engage in discussions about achieving HCV elimination within the context of the City of Warsaw's broader commitment to the goals, objectives, and targets enshrined in the *Paris Declaration on Fast-Track Cities*. We look forward to discussing innovative approaches to preventing new HCV infections and, as important, to ensure that more people living with HCV infection are screened, tested, and linked to successful treatment that leads to sustained viral suppression and, thus, a cure.
